During the summer quarter **Steve Engel** volunteered to open the Nature Center every Thursday evening. Many enjoyed the late afternoon hours in the Center, some after arriving via bicycle! Wonderful talks on bugs, birds, critters, and plants were well attended.

We participated in the **Green Expo**, sponsored by the City and the Chamber of Commerce, on September 20. This new event drew many to the Library parking lot for displays of environmentally responsible living. Shipley had a booth with fantastic photos taken by our own **Marsha Napoli**. A lovely resource book on native plants was developed by **Nancy Harris**. The participation of Shipley Nature Center was coordinated by **Steve Holden**.

The third **Vermiculture** lecture was also held on September 20 and drew a sold out crowd. There is one more lecture in the series which is co-sponsored by the **City of Huntington Beach** and **Rainbow Disposal**. That event is scheduled for October 18. Due to the wonderful response of citizens we have decided to add an additional lecture on **October 25 at 2 p.m.** The additional program is co-sponsored by **Rainbow Disposal** and **Enrecos**. At this event worm bins and worms will be sold at a **one time reduced price of \$90**. We welcome back the students with **Inside the Outdoors**. This program is run by the Orange County Department of Education and brings naturalists to the Center to teach about the outdoors and Native American history to elementary school students. We delight in providing the space for this important educational adventure.

## NURSERY – LUANNE COOK

The nursery volunteers are now assisting **Nancy Harris** in maintaining the demonstration gardens. Those of you who have visited SNC recently will notice how these gardens have grown and prospered, requiring additional care.

**Carol Williams, Luanne Cook, and Nancy Harris**, together with the volunteers are working together to increase plant production in the nursery to provide additional plants for sale in the retail area and for planting in the grounds of SNC. We now have an automatic watering system, have reorganized to make room for additional plants and are working to obtain additional growing tables.

With increasing awareness of the need to conserve water there is a growing interest in adding water wise succulents to home gardens. If you have any interesting specimens we would welcome cuttings to add to our nursery stock. Also if you have any unused clay or ceramic containers you would be willing to donate we would welcome these also.

## NATIVE TREES – JAKE HOFFMAN

Shipley Nature Center is a willing participant in the preservation of native California trees by allowing four native oak species to flourish. One species is obvious as you walk along the boardwalk under its arching branches, *Quercus agrifolia*, Coast Live Oak. Years ago a thoughtful citizen planted this mighty Californian for all of us to enjoy, far into the future, as these giants live for over 200 years.

An oak that is rarely seen in Huntington Beach is the Engelmann Oak, *Quercus engelmannii*. Planted a few years ago by the Friends of Shipley Nature Center, as a faithful companion of the Coast Live Oak, these two trees are the main components of the Southern Oak Woodland demonstration habitat that has been created at Shipley. While both oaks are evergreen, the soft blue green leaves and round acorns of the Engelmann Oak are quite a contrast to its prickly neighbor the Coast live oak with its spiny, deep green leaves and long pointy acorns.

Wedged in between the Redwoods, California Bay Laurel and perimeter fence are two Island Scrub Oaks, *Quercus parvula*. Native to the harsh climate of the Channel Islands and moist coastal canyons of Southern California mainland these oaks are of unknown potential to me as I have yet to visit these species in their native habitats. Hopefully these young trees will flourish at Shipley so everyone can enjoy them up close.

Lastly, grown from an acorn late last year, is one extremely small Canyon Live Oak, *Quercus chrysolepis*. A tree with unrivaled symmetry and beauty that will live for over 300 years but today it stands only 8 inches tall. With acorns the size of golf balls and two unique types of leaves on one tree, you will have to seek out this specimen in the wild as Shipley's oak still needs some time to fill in.

After you wander through Shipley and have counted the numbers of native oaks that are here, count how many you see on your way home. If you see one, count yourself lucky, if you see none; ask yourself, why I haven't planted an oak to enjoy.

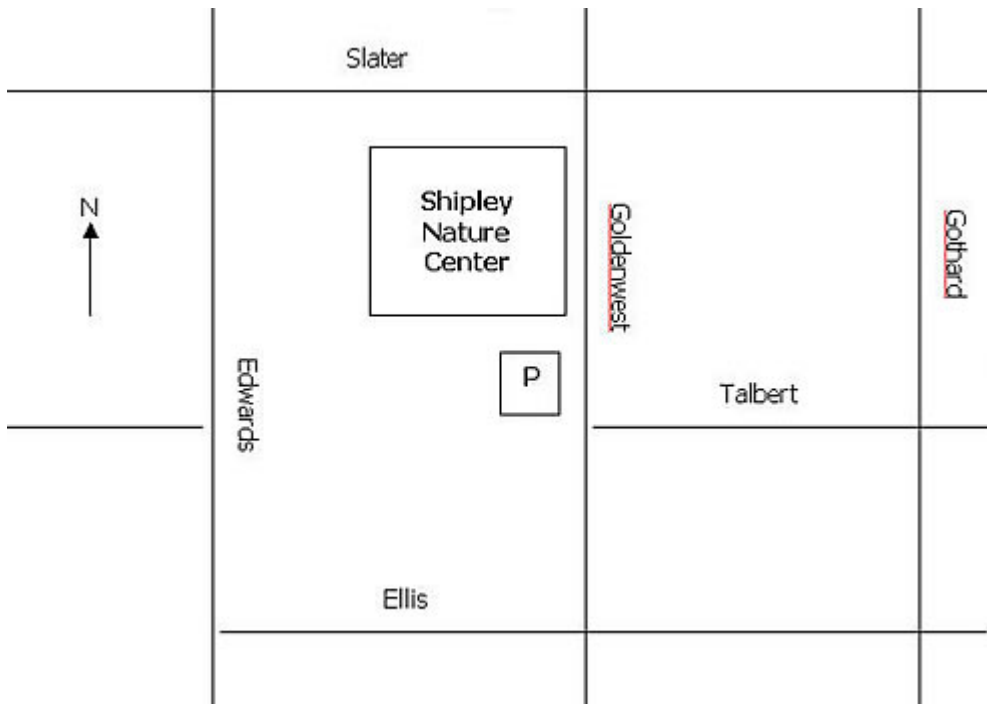


Hours: Monday through Saturday, 9:00 am to 1:00 pm, Closed Sunday.
